

## Career Exploration: Tourism in West Virginia Teacher Guide

We have provided two sets of activity sheets for middle school students that can be thought as standalone lessons or used in conjunction with each other to provide students with a fuller picture of the tourism industry in West Virginia:

- Tourism Careers in West Virginia (recommended as lesson 1)
- Tourism Attractions in West Virginia (recommended as lesson 2)

The *Tourism Attractions in West Virginia* lesson relies on allowing the students to access WVtourism.com. This could be accomplished on individual computers or tablets in groups on a smart TV, or perhaps through printouts from the website.

The printouts option is not recommended because it will limit students options for the activities and capacity to practice their research skills.

Once on the website, students can explore by selecting "Things to Do" and "Places to Go" among other options at the top of the page.

You may also want to encourage them to explore by "travel region," which they can access through "Places to Go," by selecting a region on the map to the left of the pop-up menu or directly at this url: <a href="https://wvtourism.com/places-to-go/travel-regions/">https://wvtourism.com/places-to-go/travel-regions/</a>

Students can also search the entire website by using the search bar near the top of the page.
